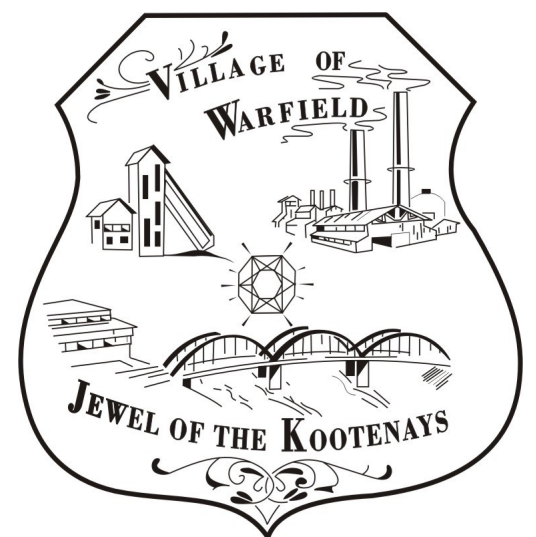

Community Reminder

With Winter right around the corner, it is time to remind residents of the Village of Warfield's plowing policy. Policy #5410 states that the priority ranking for roads are as follows:

- a) bus routes
- b) high traffic volume steep hills
- c) side streets
- d) alleys / pedestrian ways

The Village of Warfield Traffic Bylaw #545 states that: "No person shall deposit, pile or spread snow or ice cleaned from sidewalks, driveways, roofs, parking lots, automobile stations or garages or any other surface or property on any highway, sidewalk, boulevard, or other public place
