The Regional District of Kootenay Boundary Building has an excellent pamphlet that explains when a building permit is required and when it is not; what requirements are need when submitting your Building Permit Application; and so much more.

A MESSAGE FROM THE WARFIELD PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

SNOW PLOWING:

The Warfield Works Department would like to "Thank" the residents for their patience while our Sanding Truck was in need of repairs last month. It is back in service and we are doing our best to keep all the roads plowed and sanded.

For the safe passage to others, we ask that you do not push or snow blow your snow onto the streets from your driveway or sidewalk (Bylaw #545).

WHO DO YOU CALL IF YOUR **SEWER BACKS UP?**

If you have a sewer back up in your residence, the Village Policy states that the home owner is responsible to:

- 1) call out a qualified plumber to respond to any private sewer problems.
- 2) the plumber will determine the cause and where the blockage is located,
- 3) the Village Works will be contacted if the blockage is on Village property.
- 4) the Village of Warfield is not responsible for blockages on or damage to private sewer resulting from tree roots regard less of their origin; or from grease or other items being discarded via the sewer.

To help keep these sewer pipes from plugging and causing unnecessary flooding issues in residents' basements, the Public Works would like to remind residents that only dispose of human waste and toilet paper into your sewer.

Other waste items such as: disposable diapers; non-biodegradable hygiene products—tampons & pads; shop rags; grease,

oil or any other substance could cause problems to our sewer lift stations and pipes. If you have any questions or concerns, contact the Public Works Department at ⇒ 250-368-5455.
